

## CSS Only: Spaced navbar with List

1. Make the navbar into a list

```
<div id="navbar">
  <ul>
    <li><a href="../index.html">English</a></li>
    <li><a href="../espanol.html">Español</a></li>
    <li><a href="../resources.html">Resources</a></li>
    <li><a href="../contact.html">Contact</a></li>
  </ul>
```

2. Add this code to the CSS.

```
#navbar {
  position: absolute;
  left: 235px;
  top: 100px;
  width: 315px;
  height: 24px;
  z-index: 10;
  font-family: Verdana, Geneva, sans-serif;
  font-size: 9px;
  color: #fff;
  text-align: right;
}
#navbar li {
  list-style-type: none;
  display: inline;
  margin-left: 10px;
}
```

## Changing the color of a link on the current child page when using a template.

1. Add this code to the html and css on the template

```
<div id="navbar">
  <ul>
    <li><a href="../index.html" class="englishlink">English</a></li>
    <li><a href="../espanol.html" class="espanollink">Español</a></li>
    <li><a href="../resources.html" class="resourceslink">Resources</a></li>
    <li><a href="../contact.html" class="contactlink">Contact</a></li>
  </ul>
```

```
#english a.englishlink,
#espanol a.espanollink,
#resources a.resourceslink,
#contact a.contactlink { /* used to highlight active top navigation category. only activated by template properties when changing ID in body tags */
  color: #f00;
  cursor: default;
}
```

2. create editable attribute on the body tag.

3. open each page and change the body ID to any of the 4 choices (english, espanol, resources, contact)
