

CSS Image Rollovers

1. Setup by opening the template file and removing the `` tag. then add a class to the link `<a>` tag.

```
<div id="logo" class="span-4">  
  <a href="../index.html" class="cssrollover"></a>  
</div><!-- end #logo -->
```

2. Prepare an image with both the normal and rollover states included in one file such as this .PNG:



For this example the image specs are:

Width: 150px

Height: 350px (175px for each state)

2. Add this code to your CSS to call up the image as part of the link (as a background) and to have it mimic the behavior of the original static image, but only show the first rollover state (silver).

```
.cssrollover {  
  width: 150px;  
  height: 175px;  
  display: block;  
  background-image: url('../images/medicalsegn_onoff.png');  
}
```

3. Add this code to your CSS to change the position of the background image when the user rolls over the link. Notice that the horizontal position does not change in this case, but the vertical changes to slide the image background up to show the second state (gold).

```
.cssrollover:hover {  
  background-position: 0px 175px;  
}
```

4. Repeat this for every clickable image based rollover, just adding new classes and images for each.
